Summary: Requires mandatory withholding of income tax from distributions from employer-sponsored retirement plans. Requires mandatory withholding of income tax when Oregon real property interests are sold by nonresidents. Applies to distributions and sales occurring on or after January 1, 2006. Allows local governments that impose personal income tax that meets certain requirements to request that Department of Revenue provide collection services, including collection of tax on state income tax return forms. Appropriates moneys from Local Income Tax Collections Fund to Department of Revenue for distribution to local governments. Authorizes state agencies, boards and commissions that issue occupational or professional licenses to require licensees to demonstrate and maintain tax compliance as condition of issuance or renewal of license. Authorizes Department of Revenue to adopt rules that require payers of certain types of payments identified by department to withhold income tax from payments. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.
